Who are the protagonists in this book's situation? What did you think of them?

Did you remain engaged with the new situation?

What would you feel in similar circumstances?

As a leader, what seems most important to Grace?

What are her concerns?

What does she feel confident about?

How would you deal with what she has to handle?

Is Duncan also a leader in his own right?

At what point does he adopt this role?

How much do you think Duncan's grandmother has shaped his life?

What choices do you believe he has made contrary to his upbringing, if any?

What are your thoughts about Skelly?

Do you agree with Grace keeping him secret? If yes, why? If no, why not?

Is your favorite character still the same in this book? Why, or why not?

There are happy moments and distressing ones, causing joy, anger, sadness, regret, desperation, etc. Are the emotions the characters feel because of them understandable to you in the context of your daily life?

These teens are unlikely but steadfast friends. Do you have a friend you've viewed in the same way?

Does each character possess their own positive attributes, as well as negatives? What are they?

Do you think the characters' gifts or skills aid them all in survival and forward momentum?

Do you have a favorite scene or quote from this book? If so, please share and explain why.
